We are trying something new this year! We want our children to enjoy spending time with their families at sports day and inspire a love of sports. We will have ten different activities for the children to take part in in a carousel. Parents and families that are attending will follow their children as they partake in the different activities. We would like parents to wait at the gate 10 minutes before the time stated above. You will then be let in by a member of staff and taken to wait with your child in their group. Mr Lawton and the year 6's will then take you to the set station and blow a whistle when it is time to move on to the next one. The 'races' will be performed as one of the activities on the carousel and children will be encouraged to race in front of the small audience of family members as opposed to our past way of competing in front of a large audience. At the end of the event a whistle will be sounded two times and children will respond by saying a quick goodbye and lining up outside their classes with their class teacher in order to be registered. With this being brand new, please try to be patient and supportive. We are confident that this will be an enjoyable day for our children. We will be keeping an eye out for the weather forecast and keeping you up to date as soon as possible. For now, please cross your fingers for sunshine.

Walk/Cycle to school

Again, can I please encourage you to walk or cycle where possible. This will help to ease the congestion on the school turning circle. When outside of school, I am still seeing several vehicles using the double yellow lines as a place to leave their vehicle, which in turn make I dangerous to use the crossing, due to or children and families' view being restricted.

Also, can I please stress that **KS1 children must not be left unaccompanied at the school gate**. Until they have entered the school premises, they are a parent/ carer's responsibility. Children at age 5 or 6 are not at the age to be left and expected to remain safe and free from misbehaviour with their peers. We are having more instances of children coming in upset because they have had a fallout outside the gates or fallen and injured themselves.



Sports events

We are continuing to play lots of sports in the warmer (I wish I could say sunnier weather). Our year 3 and 4 teams have performed brilliantly at another round of the Bramcote athletics. Our year 1 and 2's were fantastic at Wheatcroft, where they got their first chance of playing school team football. We have had our year 5/6's play more cricket. This time getting a chance to play at North Marine Road. Each time our children represent the school it makes us so proud how they show respect, resilience and responsibility in all that they do. Our aim is to make our children active adults and we want to keep giving them lots of opportunities to partake in sport.

Bagel mornings

It has been great to see some families making use of the Overdale Breakfast bar on a morning. The option is always going to be there and it is completely free so if it has been a hectic morning or your child is like mine and likes to fuel themselves as much as possible for the day ahead, you can pop in and grab a bagel to go or grab a quick bowl of cereal. Again, once your child has received their bagel please take them into school the normal way - rather than through the office.





KS1 children/ school gates

We seem to have a number of children entering school through our front doors at the moment which is causing a backlog at our school office. The office is extremely busy on a morning and needs to be kept clear to allow our office manager to take calls and speak with any parents that have any urgent issues. Those using the front entrance must do so after seeking approval from school.

Staffing

Well, it has been all systems go this year in terms of the recruitment of staffing due to our growing numbers. Due to a number of reasons our school has grown from having 252 children to currently 318. This has been a real pleasant surprise which has required us to work fast and recruit more staff. We now have two expectant mothers in our staffing team, so we have acted quickly to seek maternity cover also. We will welcome Olivia Hall and Stephanie Rogers next year as class teachers and we currently have an advert out for a year 2 teacher who will replace a departing teacher who is moving onto pastures new.

School wraparound care

In September, we will be extending our wraparound care! With some new staff appointments. We will be offering a breakfast club (7:50am-8:40am) to our 2 and 3-year olds along with an after-school club (3:10pm -5:30pm). Now, due to legal ratios set for schools by the government, this may only start with a small number of children, so it will be offered on a first come first served basis. If you are interested and would like to make enquiries or potentially book a place, please get in touch with the office.





New September school hours

In government guidance, it will now be a legal requirement for schools to be open for education for 32.5 hours a week. We are not far off this but from September we will need to ever so slightly extend. The new school hours will be from 8:40am-3:10pm. Gates will be opened at usual time in the morning and 5 minutes later on an afternoon.
