Anti-Bullying week

Anti-Bullying week focused on pupils understanding of what bullying is and also how we can report any incidents in school to ensure that action is taken. We launched the week by wearing odd socks and continued to look at how we celebrate our differences. We held an assembly on the British Values of tolerance and individual liberty. Here, the children learnt about their protected characteristics and how we can respect those and take pride in who we are. Children have been working hard to create a bullying poster and a slogan that focuses on how we report bullying if we have witnessed or feel we have been a victim of bullying in school. Staff and leaders of Overdale have looked at how we deal with such issues and ensuring that they are properly investigated, with sanctions in place if necessary and contact made with parents.

2 year old provision

Our application to become a 2 year old provision is going well. We aim to have this open in January to allow us time to ensure we are adequately staffed and have a high quality setting to welcome this age group. Further updates will be coming soon in relation to places etc. I know some have put their children's names forward already. There are interviews in the next week where we hope to recruit candidates with the skills and experience to make our two-yearold provision an engaging and safe learning environment.

Buddy's first week



Buddy had a fantastic first week in school. He has had a tour around each class and all children have had opportunity to meet him. Buddy has had small sessions with children who have been able to stroke and play with him. As he continues to settle in school he will be built into the routine of more of our pupils to support them in school. On the 6th December, Dogs Trust will be visiting to deliver dog workshops. Buddy has had a fantastic effect on our pupils with a dog phobia. They have been able to stroke him and enjoy his company. Children have been told that puppies have to sleep often and also can have sharp puppy teeth that they like to explore with. This is to support them when they are walking past Buddy's gate in the corridor and when giving him a stroke.


Coming up.....

Phonics in our school

Phonics is the way we teach early reading and fluency to our pupils. There is so much that parents and families can do to support their children. Travel to school

I would encourage all parents and children to <u>walk to</u> <u>school</u> where possible. Where we are lucky to have a number of car parking spaces, these can soon be taken up.

Our neighbours are Jazz Court and they have a car park but it states that it is a PRIVATE CAR PARK and for the use of JAZZ COURT STAFF and RESIDENTS ONLY. Please observe these requests as we have a positive relationship with the staff there and wish to continue this into the future. Please do not park on the yellow lines on the turning circle. This prevents children crossing the road from seeing oncoming traffic. SLT will be available to keep our children safe and remind parents of our requests around parking. With the wet weather, we have a number of parents now parking on the double yellows. Please park your car as close as possible and walk.





Allergies in school.

If your child has a food allergy and a meeting has not been conducted previously, we will be contacting you to attend a meeting with Mrs Campbell (SENCO), and the catering services to review the food options and menu provisions we can offer in school. North Yorkshire County Caterers have reviewed their provision for children with allergies to ensure as many food options are made available to each child as is possible.
