Intention

To ensure Overdale community is a place where everyone feels safe, welcome and happy.

To ensure everyone within the Overdale community understands that bullying of any kind will be addressed and WILL NOT BE TOLERATED.

<u>Bullying</u> explained.

What is bullying?

- Bullying is actions that DELIBERATELY make another person feel distressed, threatened or frightened.
- Bullying is actions REPEATED over time.

• Bullying makes victims feel powerless to defend themselves or change the way things are.

Types of bullying:

- Physical punching, kicking, hitting, taking possessions.
- · Verbal name calling, threatening, teasing, sharing untruths
- · Nonverbal facial expressions, offensive gestures, ignoring /leaving out.
- · Emotional excluding, tormenting, unkindness, being unfriendly
- · Cyber misuse of the internet, mobile phones or cameras to bully
- · Racist racial taunts, gestures

• Homophobic / Transgender – focusing bullying on issues of gender Special Educational Needs and / or disability – focusing on specific needs.

Why we have a Zero tolerance approach to Bullying because:

- · Everyone has the right to be treated with RESPECT
- · Everyone has the right to feel safe and valued
- Bullying HURTS!
- Bullying affects a victim's capacity to learn.

Recognising signs and symptoms of bullying

- · Not wanting to come to school
- · Sleep or eating habits change
- · Tummy aches / pains
- · Withdrawn or aggressive
- Missing or damaged possessions
- Unexplained injuries
- · Suddenly afraid to use internet, mobile phone or tablet.

Understanding why Bullying happens

- . Jealousy
- . To control and feel powerful
- . They want attention
- . Peer pressure
- . To make themselves look good
- They are being bullied.

Prevention

- · Sessions are taught in school through the PHSCE curriculum
- The school's 3R's VALUES that are visible in every room around school

(See Appendix1)

 Extended services such as the NSPCC, Police and Open Book all deliver assemblies and workshops in school.

 $^{\rm \cdot}\,$ Children working with our Senco, in our Nurture provision or working with the Wellbeing Officer.

- · Focused teaching weeks e.g. Anti-bullying week that highlight the importance
 - of 'tell someone' and 'don't keep quiet'.

• The school council manage to agreement of our Anti-Bullying Slogan each year and this is displayed in every room in school. (See Appendix 2).

• All adults are aware of the need to always be approachable and take concerns seriously.

In Summary

- Bullying is REPETITIVE
- Done on purpose
- Can happen anywhere

Overdale school DOES NOT TOLERATE bullies:

- Tell a teacher or adult in school
- Tell your parent / adult at home
- Tell a friend and go together to tell an adult.
